Amramp provides ramps and platforms for the Capitol Christmas Tree 2011

Amramp provides ramps and platforms for United States Forest Service to showcase the Capitol Christmas Tree 2011 in a tour beginning in California and across the country until the tree is placed and lit in Washington D.C.

(Santa Cruz, CA)--- Amramp employees Brendan McKee and Patrick McKee brought ramps and platforms to the United States Forest Service in Sonora, CA on November 6, 2011 to enable the tour of the Capitol Christmas Tree to begin across California to Washington D.C. US Forest Service staff members accompanying the tree were trained by Brendan McKee in the assembly and disassembly of the Amramp System. The installation will be necessary at each stop along the way.

The Capitol Christmas Tree will travel to numerous cities and events so that citizens can visit the tree and sign a banner that accompanies the tree on the tour. The tour will cross California to Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Indiana, North Carolina, Virginia, Pennsylvania, Maryland and finally to Washington D.C. The month-long journey will end with the Tree Lighting on December 6 at 5 P.M. in Washington D.C. at the West Front Lawn at the Capitol Mall. The Amramp System will allow people with various abilities to walk and roll up the ramp to the platforms and see the tree and sign the banner. In previous years, disabled citizens who could not climb stairs could not fully participate in the Capitol Christmas Tree events.

The Capitol Christmas Tree 2011 was cut on November 5 in Sonora off of State Highway 108. The tree was blessed by the Me-Wuk tribe prior to the cutting.

Amramp Los Angeles will participate in the Capitol Christmas Tree tour at the Autry Center in Griffith Park, Los Angeles and at the Victoria Gardens Mall in Rancho Cucamonga.
